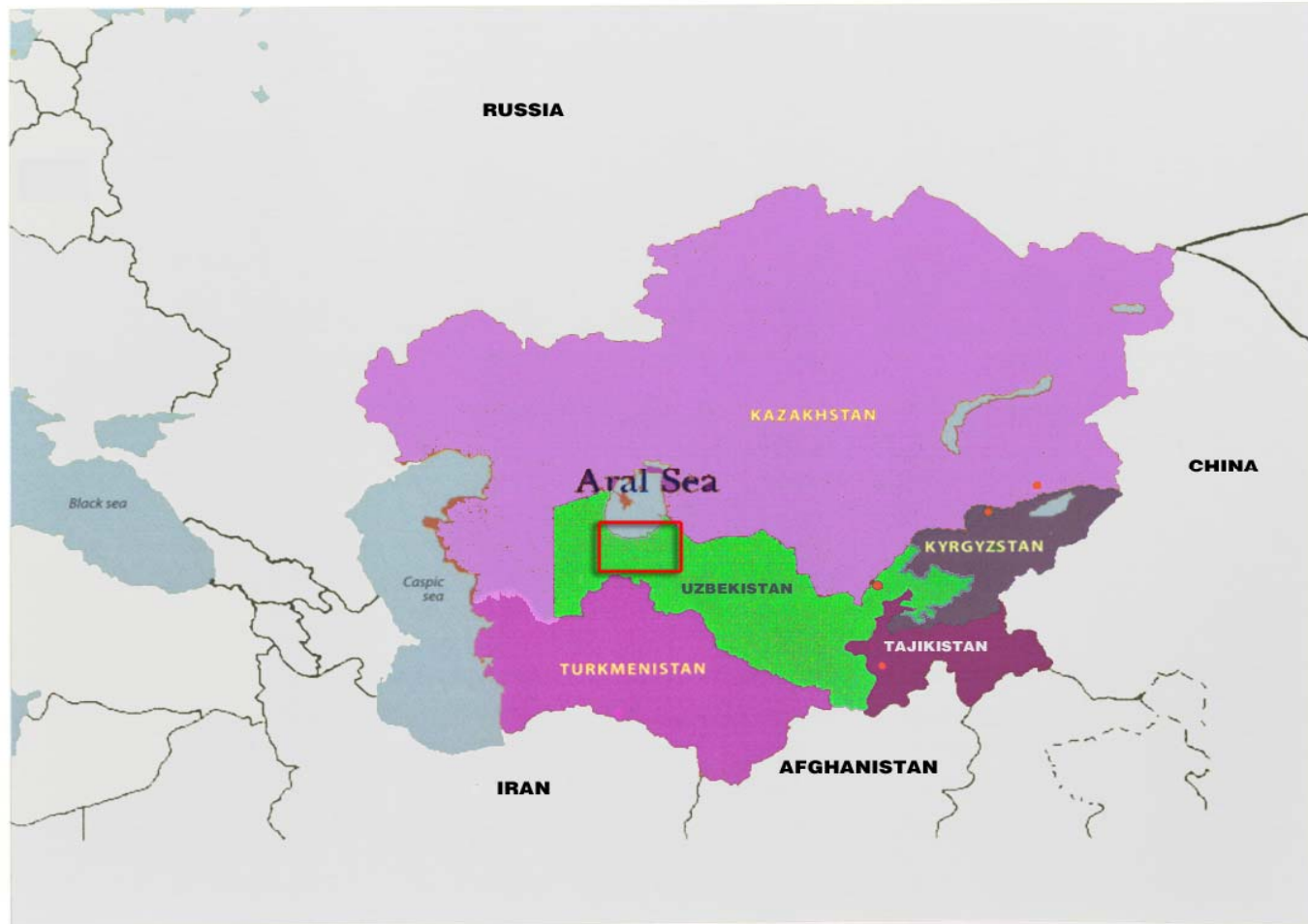

Where is the Aral Sea?

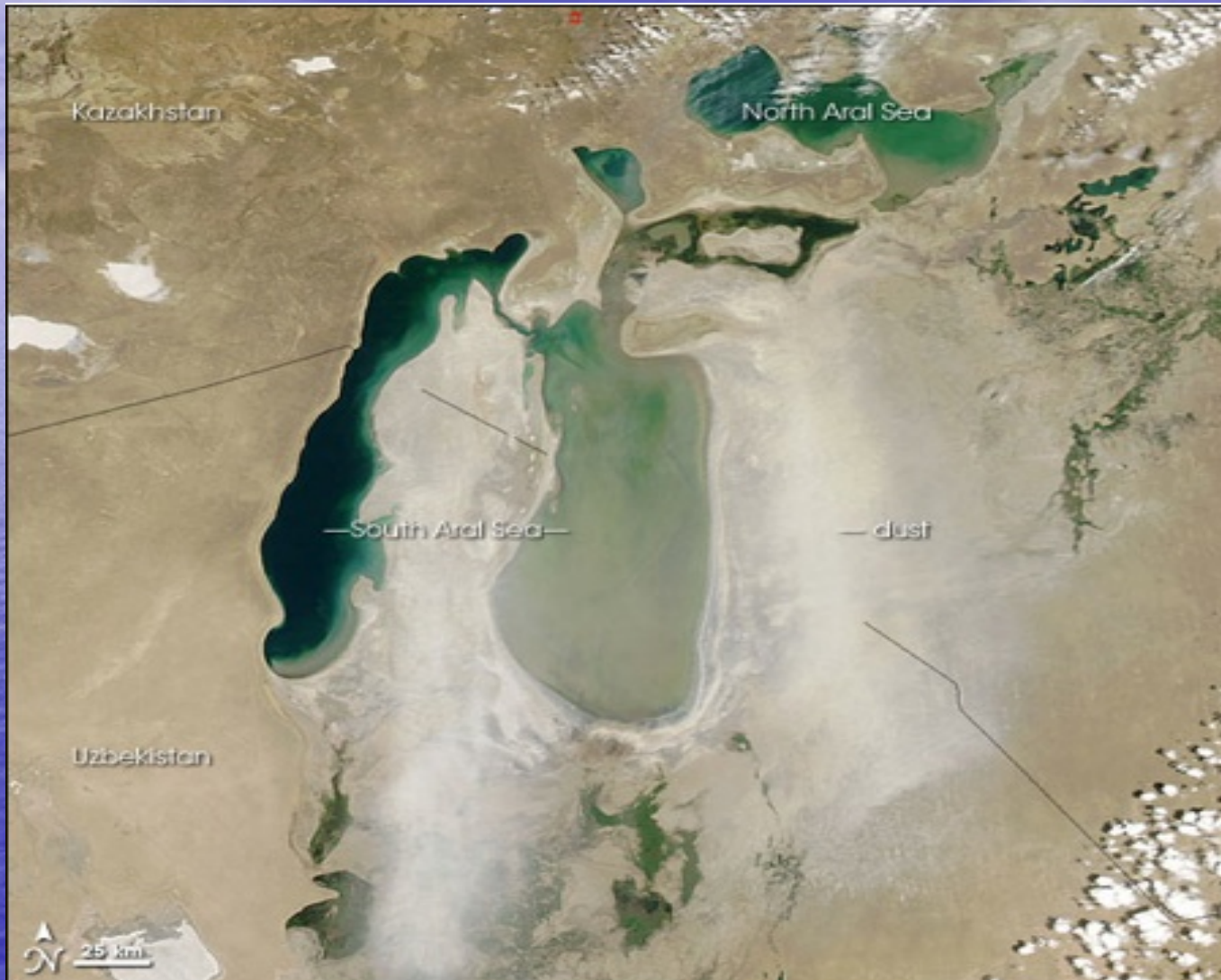


Part of the flow of the rivers Ob and Irtysh would be diverted via a 200m-wide aqueduct

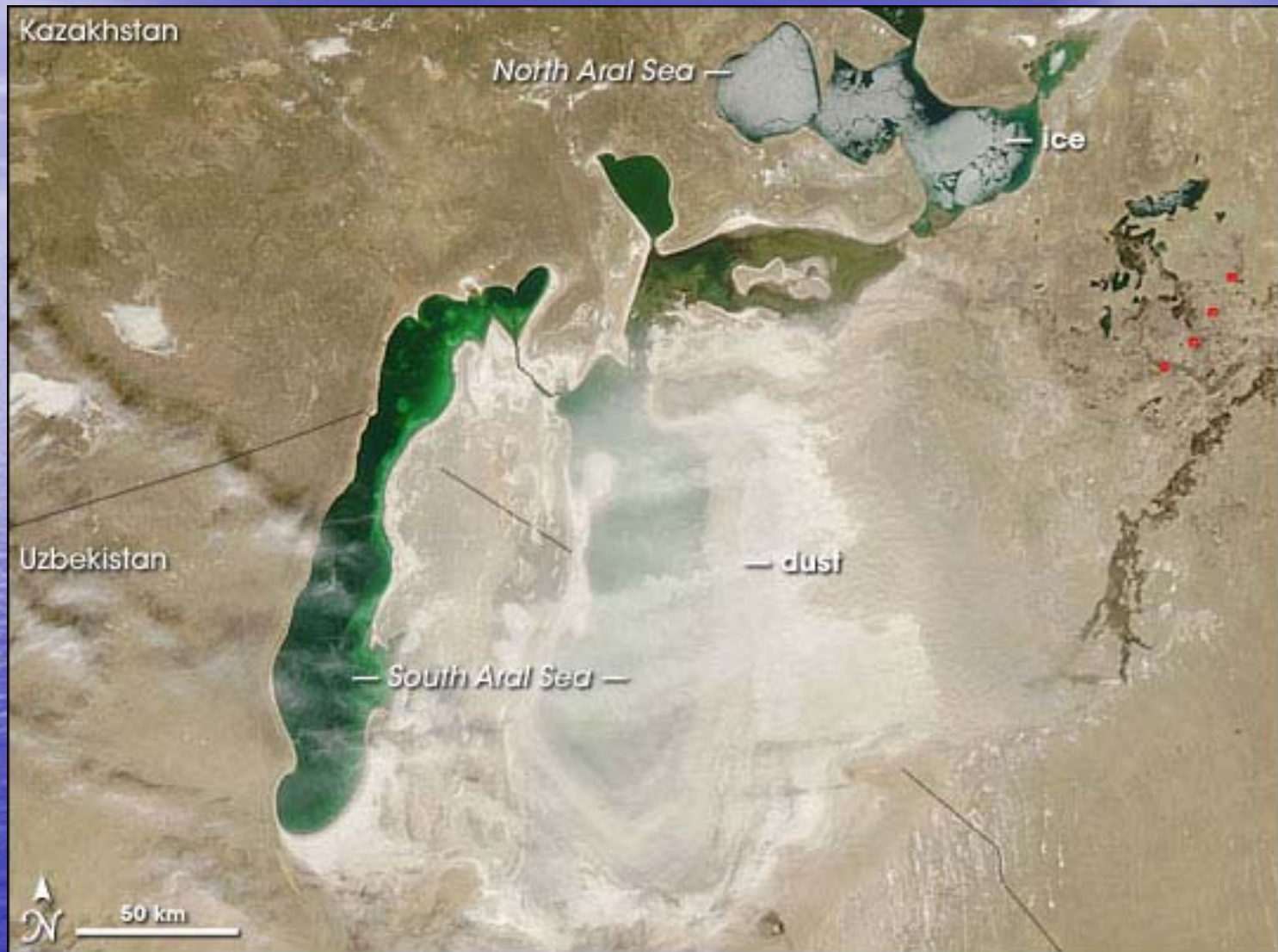
 Proposed route
